




ARRIVING LATE



A reminder that the gates are opened at **8.30** and close again at **8.45**. If you child arrives after 8.50 they will be marked as LATE. Take a look at the table below which shows how being just 5 minutes late each day can add up.

Arriving Late can affect your childs attendance

Lateness = lost learning	
(Figures below are calculated over a school year)	
5 minutes late each day	3 days lost!
10 minutes late each day	6.5 days lost!
15 minutes late each day	10 days lost!
20 minutes late each day	13 days lost!
30 minutes late each day	19 days lost!
