ARRIVING LATE



A reminder that the gates are opened at **8.30** and close again at **8.45**. If your child arrives after 8.50 they will be marked as LATE. Take a look at the table below which shows how being just 5 minutes late each day can add up.

Arriving Late can affect your child's attendance

| Lateness = lost learning | |
|---|----------------|
| (Figures below are calculated over a school year) | |
| 5 minutes late each day | 3 days lost! |
| 10 minutes late each day | 6.5 days lost! |
| 15 minutes late each day | 10 days lost! |
| 20 minutes late each day | 13 days lost! |
| 30 minutes late each day | 19 days lost! |
