Points to note Learning about Jobs

The resources we will be using during these lessons have been designed to help the children learn about skills they have and will develop over time, and how these skills are transferable in a range of contexts which will eventually include the workplace. We want for all children to feel empowered about their future and for them to know that they have multiple options and choices available to them for their future education and careers. During these lessons there will be opportunities to explore different careers, showing sensitivity to the experiences and knowledge children already have. We will also begin to address issues around stereotypes related to jobs people do and try to tackle these by making children aware that jobs are not gender specific for example.
