Dear Glenleigh Park Families

I hope you are all well. I would like to begin by thanking the vast majority of our families who consistently demonstrate kindness, consideration and respect at the school gates each day. Your support plays an important role in upholding the positive reputation of Glenleigh Park and helps us maintain a safe and welcoming environment for everyone.

As we move through the term, we would like to share a few gentle reminders about expectations at drop-off and pick-up:

- No smoking or vaping at the school gate or on school grounds.
- Children must remain supervised by their home adults at all times, including before and after the school day.
- Please be mindful of the conversations held in front of children, both your own and others, and avoid the use of foul or offensive language.
- Access for staff is required through the vehicle gate, so please ensure children do not play in or enter the driveway area, as this is unsafe.
- Remain on the pavements and keep clear of the school drive.
- Avoid parking on double yellow lines or mounting the pavements, as this restricts access for pedestrians, buggies, wheelchairs and emergency vehicles.
- Please do not tie dogs to the fence near the gates. No animals, except assistance dogs are permitted on the school site.

We would also like to remind families who enter the school using the access gate from the car park, often those with a disabled parking pass or families collecting from Nursery, to take particular care in this area. Please ensure children stay with you at all times and do not run into the car park. We ask that you wait next to the gate and limit the movement around the car park itself. These reminders are in place so that we can continue to use this entrance safely and prevent any accidents involving pedestrians and vehicles.

In addition, we kindly remind all parents and carers of our expectations regarding conduct towards staff and other families. We ask that everyone communicates in a respectful, calm and considerate manner at all times. This supports positive relationships, appropriate behaviour and a safe, respectful school community. Thank you for continuing to model the behaviours we expect our children to learn and follow.

These expectations are in place solely to ensure the safety and wellbeing of our children, families and staff. Your ongoing cooperation makes a real difference.

Thank you once again for working with us and for being such an important part of our school community. By continuing to support one another and modelling positive behaviour, we help create an environment in which all children can arrive at school feeling safe, calm and ready to learn.
